

Notes from the Library





Notes From the Nurse



If your child has borrowed clothes from the clinic, please return those items as soon as they have been laundered. As the clinic is running low on clothing items, students in Pre-K and Kindergarten are encouraged to bring a change of clothes to school in their backpack.

Vision screenings have been completed for grades 1, 3, and 5 as required by the State of Indiana. If your child brought home a referral or you have questions, please call the nurse, Mrs. Smith, @ 376-4445. Financial resources are available.


Hearing screenings have been completed for grades 1 and 4 as required by the State of Indiana. If your child brought home a referral or you have questions, please call the nurse at 376-4445.

Please encourage your child to cover his/her nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing, and to wash their hands as needed.

A student must be fever free for 24 hours, without any fever-reducing medication, before they should return to school. If a student has 2 or more episodes of diarrhea and/or vomiting in a 24 hour period, they need to be kept home until symptoms are gone. Health policies may be found starting on page 15 of the student handbook. When in doubt if your child should come to school or not, please call the nurse at 376-4445.

Reminder to parents that all medication **MUST** be brought to the nurse by an adult. Children are not allowed to bring medication to school. This includes pills, creams, sprays, etc. **COUGH DROPS ARE NOT ALLOWED AT SCHOOL!** They are a potential choking hazard.
