Thank you, parents, for making appointments and getting students immunized. Your efforts are greatly appreciated! As you continue to keep your children current, please remember to send in a copy of immunizations to the Health Clinic at W.D. Richards. This way we can keep your student's file up to

*Unfortunately, flu season continues through March. It is not too late to get your flu shots at the Health Department or your doctor's office. date. Each year there are small changes in immunization requirements. Watch for letters to come home when this happens. Most recently students 11 years of age need a Tdap, Varicella and Menactra inoculation prior to $6^{\text {th }}$ grade.


*BSCS is not able to administer cough drops to students K-6. Cough drops are a choking hazard and BCSC employees are not able to dispense. Another method used for a sore throat or cough - salt water gargling. If cough syrup is needed, please administer to child prior to school.
*A stomach virus has been going around our community. If your child is ill, please follow the guidelines when deciding if your child is too sick for school:
Students must be fever free for $\mathbf{2 4}$ hours without fever reducer medication.
