School Safety Week

Dear Parent/Guardians.

Although each month we practice emergency drills at Richards Elementary in order to ensure we are doing all we can to keep all students and staff safe, we are deeming the week of March 30 School Safety Week. During this week, we will practice a fire drill, a tornado drill, a lockdown drill, and an evacuation drill. Many students will be practicing the evacuation drill for the first time. Prior to the drills, teachers will discuss with students when we would use such procedures. The evacuation drill will take place on April 3 around 1:30 p.m. Our evacuation site is First Baptist Church across the street. If your child has an appointment in the afternoon on April 3, please pick him/her up before 1:15 or after 2:00 as we will be unable to dismiss from the church during the drill.

In the event of an actual fire, after a tornado, natural gas leak, or similar event, we would evacuate to our evacuation site. If an actual emergency were to occur, students would be picked up from our parent receiving site, which is L.F. Smith Elementary School. We are only practicing an evacuation drill on April 3 and will dismiss from Richards at the regular dismissal time.

April 28th- Students will get an introduction to Earth's natural method of waste disposal




Math Bowl Results

2015-16 School Year Kindergarten Enrollment

Children who will be entering Kindergarten this fall (2015-2016) should register at their neighborhood school.

A parent/guardian must enroll the child. A Kindergarten student must be age 5 by August 1, 2015 (born on or before August 1, 2010) for the 2015-2016 school year. Please call Chanda Welsh with Kindergarten questions at 812.376.4392.

The following items are required to register for Kindergarten and should be brought to the Roundup:

The child's birth certificate.

The child's updated immunization record.

Proof of residency for the family with whom the child resides. Acceptable items to use as proof of residency are a gas bill, a water bill, an electric bill or lease agreement. Cable bills, home phone and internet bills and cell phone bills are not acceptable as proof of residency.

If you do not have proof of residency, you will need to schedule an appointment with Becky Schwantes at 812.376.4280 to complete an Affidavit of Residency form. Her office is located in the Information Services Center located at 2650 Home Avenue. To complete this form, parents/guardians will need to bring a picture ID, and, if living with someone else, a utility bill with the homeowners name and address on it.

Required Immunizations

The parent MUST have provided an immunization record to the school by the first day of classes. Kindergarten and first grade children who do not have the required immunizations within thirty (30) calendar days from time of school enrollment may be withdrawn from school. Such withdrawal shall be in compliance with Indiana Code 20-8. 1-7, as amended.

- 5 doses of DTaP (diptheria-tetanus-acellular pertussis)
- 4 doses of Polio
- 3 doses of Hepatitis B vaccine
- 2 doses MMR (measles, mumps, & rubella) vaccine
- 2 doses of Varicella (chicken pox) vaccine

2 doses of Hepatitis A vaccine

Complete physical and dental exams are recommended, but not required

If the parent requires assistance with immunizations, the school principal should be contacted immediately. It is recommended that children receive the required immunizations prior to Kindergarten enrollment week.

AÑO ESCOLAR 2015-2016 - INSCRIPCION PARA EL KINDERGARTEN

Los niños que comenzarán el Kindergarten este otoño (año escolar 2015-2016) deberán inscribirse en la escuela.

Uno de los papás/guardián legal deberá inscribir al niño. Un estudiante de Kindergarten deberá tener 5 años cumplidos al 10. de agosto del 2015 (haber nacido el 10. de agosto del 2010 o antes) para poder ser inscrito en el año escolar 2015 - 2016. Para cualquier pregunta sobre Kindergarten, favor de comunicarse con Chanda Welsh al 812.376.4392.

Por favor traiga los siguientes documentos requeridos para la inscripción de los niños en el Kindergarten:

Acta de nacimiento

Registro actualizado de vacunas

Verificación de residencia de la familia con quien vive el niño. Los documentos aceptables para la verificación de residencia son: Recibo de gas, agua, electricidad o contrato de renta de la casa. Los siguientes documentos NO serán aceptados como verificación de domicilio: Recibos de cable, teléfono, internet o de teléfono celular.

Si usted no tiene un documento de verificación de residencia, necesitará programar una cita con Becky Schwantes al teléfono 812.376-4280 para completar el formato de Affidavit de Residencia. Su oficina está localizada en el Centro de Servicios en el 2650 de la Avenida Home. Para completar esta forma, los padres/guardianes necesitarán traer una identificación con fotografía, y, si viven con alguien más, traer además un recibo de servicios con el nombre y dirección del dueño de la casa.

Vacunas Requeridas

Los padres DEBERAN haber proporcionado una copia del registro actual de vacunas a la escuela a más tardar el primer día de clases. Los estudiantes de Kindergarten y primer grado quienes no cumplan con los requisitos de vacunación dentro de los treinta (30) días calendario de la fecha de su inscripción a la escuela podrán ser dados de baja de la escuela. Estas dadas de baja de la escuela serán en cumplimiento al Código de Indiana 20-8. 1-7, según sus modificaciones.

- 5 dosis de DTaP (difteria-tétanos-tos ferina)
- 4 dosis de Polio
- 3 dosis de la vacuna contra la Hepatitis B
- 2 dosis de la vacuna contra la MMR (sarampión, paperas y rubéola)
- 2 dosis de la vacuna contra la Varicela

2 dosis de la vacuna contra la Hepatitis A

Un examen físico y dental completos son recomendables, pero no son requeridos.

Si los padres necesitan asistencia con las vacunas, se deberá notificar al director de la escuela inmediatamente. Se recomienda que los niños reciban las vacunas requeridas antes de la semana de inscripción al Kindergarten.


