Dear Parents,
The week of May $18^{\text {th }}$ - May $21^{\text {st }}$ will be the Relay Week for our Relay Recess! A Relay Recess is an extension of the American Cancer Society Relay For Life that's already held in our community. Relay For Life is a fun filled, overnight event that helps educate people about cancer and cancer prevention and gives them a chance to celebrate survivors, remember loved ones lost and fight back against this disease. Many schools across the country hold Relay Recess and Richards is excited to support this cause again this year!

We are going to do a Penny War again this year as our Relay Recess to raise money for Relay For Life. How a Penny War works is that each class will have a container in a centralized location in the school. Each day children can bring in Pennies to drop into their class container. Now, here is where the competition begins! Silver and dollars count against you. So, if your child drops a nickel, quarter or dollar into another class container, it counts that many pennies (nickel-5 pennies, quarter - 25 pennies, etc) AWAY from that class total. The totals are counted each day and on Thursday we decide the winner! On Friday morning May $22^{\text {nd }}$, the winning class will be announced and that class gets a PIZZA PARTY sponsored by Little Caesars that day.

Points to Remember:

- No money will be counted after 8:30am each morning for that day's total.

Any money collected AFTER 8:30am THURSDAY will not count toward the penny war but will be counted toward the school's total contribution.
