

Early Childhood Integrated Pathway Three-Year Olds

Four-day-a-week (Monday-Thursday) program available half-day (am or pm)

Dear Parents/Guardians.

BCSC will be offering an additional Early Childhood Integrated Pathway for 3-year-olds with and without disabilities, beginning the 2013-14 school year at Parkside Elementary School. The program will provide a language enriched environment, which includes activities such as circle time, learning centers, guided play and instruction for students with and without disabilities. The fee is \$45 per week, with NO SCHOLARSHIPS available for this program.

If your child will be 3-years-old ON or BEFORE August 1st, 2013 (born on or before 8-1-10), SAVE the Date!



April 19th, 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., Parkside Elementary School, 1400 Parkside Drive

May 3rd, 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., Parkside Elementary School, 1400 Parkside Drive

Please bring the following Registration Requirements:

- Proof of Residence (rental receipt, gas, electric or water bill, lease agreement, mortgage, etc.)
 Cannot accept cable/phone bills!
- Child's Birth Certificate
- Updated Immunization Records
- Financial information in regard to free/reduced meals will be collected at the beginning of the 2013/2014 school year.

To meet the educational needs of your child, the number of students in each class will be *limited to sixteen*, 8 students without disabilities and 8 students with disabilities. To ensure your child's placement, please enroll during the registration date and time. If you have any family or friends that have an "age eligible" child, please share this information with them. A *maximum of 48 students* will be accepted and enrolled on a first come basis.
