Nurse Notes

Vision screenings have been completed for grades 1, 3, and 5 as required by the State of Indiana. If your child brought home a referral, and you have questions, please call the nurse, Mrs. Smith, @ 376-4445. Financial resources are available.

Please encourage your child to cover their nose/mouth when coughing or sneezing, and to wash their hands as needed. A student must be fever free for 24 hours, without any fever-reducing medication, before they should return to school. If a student has 2 or more episodes of diarrhea and/or vomiting in a 24 hour period, they need to be kept home until symptoms are gone. Health policies may be found starting on page 15 of the student handbook. When in doubt if your child should come to school, please call the nurse at 376-4445.

A reminder to parents, all medication **MUST** be brought to the nurse by an adult. Children are not allowed to bring medication to school. This includes pills, creams, sprays, etc. **COUGH DROPS ARE NOT ALLOWED AT SCHOOL!** They are a potential choking hazard.

If your child has borrowed clothes from the clinic, please return those items as soon as they have been laundered. The clinic is running low on both small and medium sizes in boys

News From the Art Room

Happy Fall! The 6th Gr. Art classes worked collaboratively on creating art for an auction item during the Fall Festival (Friday Nov. 8th, 5:30-8:30). Please come and make a bid on their beautiful work. Also, a few of the classes made some "Mini-Masterpieces" refrigerator magnets to have your very own masterpiece on your fridge! I hope you will come and support our students' work and our wonderful PTO!

Some parents have asked how I assess student artwork. First, I use a Discipline-Based approach in instruction. DBAE includes the four components of: art history, production, aesthetics and criticism. Our art lessons include learning about the elements and principles of art. The projects also have concepts and skills that are either introduced or reinforced in a lesson and are given to us from the IDOE as standards for the visual arts. Any possible connections to other subject areas are also included during a lesson. Assessments in Grades 2-6 are based upon the application of skills and concepts included for the lesson, effort, craftsmanship, creativity and the inclusion of the elements and principles of design. Assessment for K-1 is based upon applying their best effort in demonstrating the concept and skill and materials.

What can you do to help your child with their art skills? Like any area of learning, making it important increases their willingness to put forth the effort needed to master the skill and concept. Give them time at home to create their own art. Emphasize the importance of art in our world which comes from our creative, right-brain side. Take them to museums, plays, musical events and support an arts-rich lifestyle. Let them practice looking at their environment and encourage their imagination. If you show an interest in their artwork, they will want to put more effort in creating it! Art enriches our lives and gives an outlet for the creativity within us all.

All students should have

appropriate clothing for outside play. Contact our school nurse if you need assistance in obtaining warm clothing. Students with health conditions that don't allow outside play must provide a doctor's statement. All students must participate in outdoor recess, unless a doctor's statement is on file.






