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C⁴ Columbus Area Career Connection 2012 - 2013 One-Year Follow-Up Study

The local One-Year Follow-Up Study of the class of 2012-2013 reports the status of 375 of the 387 exiting seniors who completed C⁴ programming their senior year of high school. This 97 percent return confirms that the findings in this study present a reliable and accurate status of each student. The findings, as detailed in this document, confirm the effectiveness of the education C⁴ provides each student in that they completed their C⁴ class, graduated from high school, continued their education and secured a higher wage from training-related employment.

C⁴ continues to meet the challenge of completing two follow-up studies involving two different sets of students. The local C⁴ study cohort includes a graduating class of students who were enrolled in a multiple-hour C⁴ Career & Technical Education (CTE) class during their senior year, thus showing the impact teachers, staff and programming have on C⁴ student success. By contrast, the State study includes the senior class of students who took at least six credits in CTE during the course of high school, not necessarily during their senior year, and not all CTE credits necessarily from C⁴ or the Area CTE District (District #41). This scattered group complicates the ability to make contact. To add to the challenge, C⁴ is unaware of the actual number of students included in the State study. C⁴ is only provided names of students the State has no means of tracing using social security numbers or students who are involved in activity outside the State of Indiana. C⁴ participates in the State study, which usually includes 250 students, solely to ensure that the required Placement Core Indicator is met.

It came as no surprise that contacting students was once again extremely difficult. While accurate and reliable, some information came from teachers, family members or social media, leaving some information unavailable such as satisfaction with C⁴ and hourly wages earned. In comparing this information with previous years, the variance is insignificant to the results. There has always been reluctance in reporting wages, and that continues to hold true. One could deduce that satisfaction, while very abstract, could come from the connection between training related figures for employment and education. Overall, 52 percent of the C⁴ Class of 2013 was engaged in training related employment and 74 percent were engaged in training related education which could infer satisfaction, and certainly supports the effectiveness of C⁴ education.

Our vision states that “C⁴ will connect community resources to provide career education for all students while laying the foundation for life-long learning.” The results of this study are found to be highly reflective of the total class, due to the 97 percent return rate.

C⁴ has chosen to view follow-up statistics by Clusters. This view provides a more focused perspective and promotes program improvement through teams developed to deliver connected occupational training. Clusters will compile trend data to enable teams to set goals for improvement and monitor achievement.

As a result, the information gained from respondents of the Class of 2013 is shared in the statistical review of the findings and recommendations that follow:

In terms of Employment . . . (See Employment chart and graphs, pages 12, 13, 20, 21, 22 & 23)

- . . . **75% Employed**, of which
 - 55% Full-time**
 - 39% Part-time**
 - 5% Military**
 - 1% Stay-at home parent**
- . . . **52%** of the respondents are employed in **C⁴ Training Related** positions.

- . . . **Overall, 99.5% Graduated or completed requirements for high school completion**
- . . . **98.6% Graduated according to NCLB laws**

 - 10% Technical Honors Diploma**

- . . . **74%** are continuing their education in **C⁴ Related** areas of study.

Wage Statistics (See Wage chart & graphs, pages 12 & 13)

At the time of this study, the minimum wage was \$7.25 per hour. Of those who reported wages on this study, C⁴ learned that:

The Training Related Wage averaged \$11.17 per hour
The Non-Training Related Wage averaged \$9.05 per hour.

The Training Related wage is \$3.92 above minimum wage, and
\$2.12 more than those who earned wages
from non-training-related employment.

173 of the 283 (61%) respondents employed reported wages,
rendering the wage statistics reliable.

Review of Findings

1. The 97 percent **return** rate ties the highest return (Class of 2010 and 2012) and confirms that the findings in this study present a reliable and accurate status of each student. Additionally, this return rate confirms the effectiveness of the education C⁴ provides each student in that they completed their C⁴ class, graduated from high school, continued their education and secured a higher wage from training-related employment.

2. The **graduation** rate for the class of 2013 is again remarkable at 99.5 percent. While Indiana is a waived State for No Child Left Behind (NCLB), the changes associated with the waiver are still unclear. This study documents the graduation rate to include all students who earned a work-based readiness waiver, certificate of completion, GED or any State-recognized diploma. The NCLB graduation rate stands at 98.6 percent!
4. The total of respondents **employed** showed a marked increase up 10% to 75%, indicating an upturn in the economy while the training related rate remained steady at 52%.
5. **Continuing education** saw an increase from 60 percent to 65 percent, likely due to an improved economy. It is impressive to note that 74 percent of those continuing their education are enrolled in higher education programs related to the C⁴ CTE area of study. That is just 6 percent under the highest training related statistic of 80 percent. C⁴ graduates are receiving valuable training in high school which enables them to carry on their education by connecting them to post-secondary schools to continue their C⁴ training.
6. **Military** enlistment dropped slightly from 7 percent to 5 percent, likely due to an improved economy. With more jobs available, fewer respondents are choosing the military.
7. The **training related wage** averaged at \$11.17 per hour, increasing \$0.36 from the previous year's results. The minimum wage at the time of this study was \$7.25, making the average wage \$3.92 above the minimum. The gap between the Training-Related wage and the Non-Training-Related wage of \$9.05 continues to show a strong difference of \$2.12. Overall, the wage data confirms that C⁴ education develops graduates who are worthy of earning competitive wages.
8. This is the twelfth year for this study to assess overall **satisfaction** and benefit of taking a C⁴ program. On a scale of one to five, with five being the highest, respondents ranked their satisfaction with C⁴ education at 4.265. While accurate and reliable, some information obtained for this study came from teachers, family members or social media, leaving some data unavailable such as satisfaction with C⁴ and hourly wages earned. In comparing this information with previous years, the variance is insignificant to the results. With reluctance in reporting wages and satisfaction being an abstract opinion, C⁴ looks at the connection between training related figures for employment and education. With 52 percent of the C⁴ Class of 2013 engaged in training related employment activities and 74 percent engaged in educational activities, certainly makes the case for satisfaction, and supports the effectiveness of C⁴ education. Additionally, **95%** of all students surveyed are engaged in employment, continued education or both.

Closing Comments:

Each year that a C⁴ Follow-Up Study is completed, it is interesting to watch the statistics unfold to tell the C⁴ story for that class of students who are continuing their journey after high school. This is the eighth year for the C⁴ Follow-Up study to look at those students who were not engaged in employment, continued education, military service or stay-at-home parents.

This study found that 20 of the 375 (5 percent) students contacted were not engaged. This means that **95 percent (355)** of the students who completed C⁴ programs during the 2012-13 school year **were either competitively employed, pursuing higher education, raising their children as stay-at-home parents or enlisted in military service after high school.**

It is also important to point out that both **employment (75 percent)** and **continuing education (65 percent)** results show that C⁴ students are choosing appropriate placements after high school.

This data coupled with a **99 percent graduation rate** certainly proves that C⁴ provides students with valuable career and technical education training while still in high school, paving the road to a bright, competitive future.

Area 41: Participating School Information

A breakdown of Follow-Up information from Area District # 41 Schools can be found on **Pages 24 to 27**. It is remarkable that among Area District #41 CTE students **93%** were either **competitively employed, pursuing higher education or enlisted in military service after high school** and **75 percent** of those respondents employer and **52 percent** of those employer are using C⁴ education in their current placements.

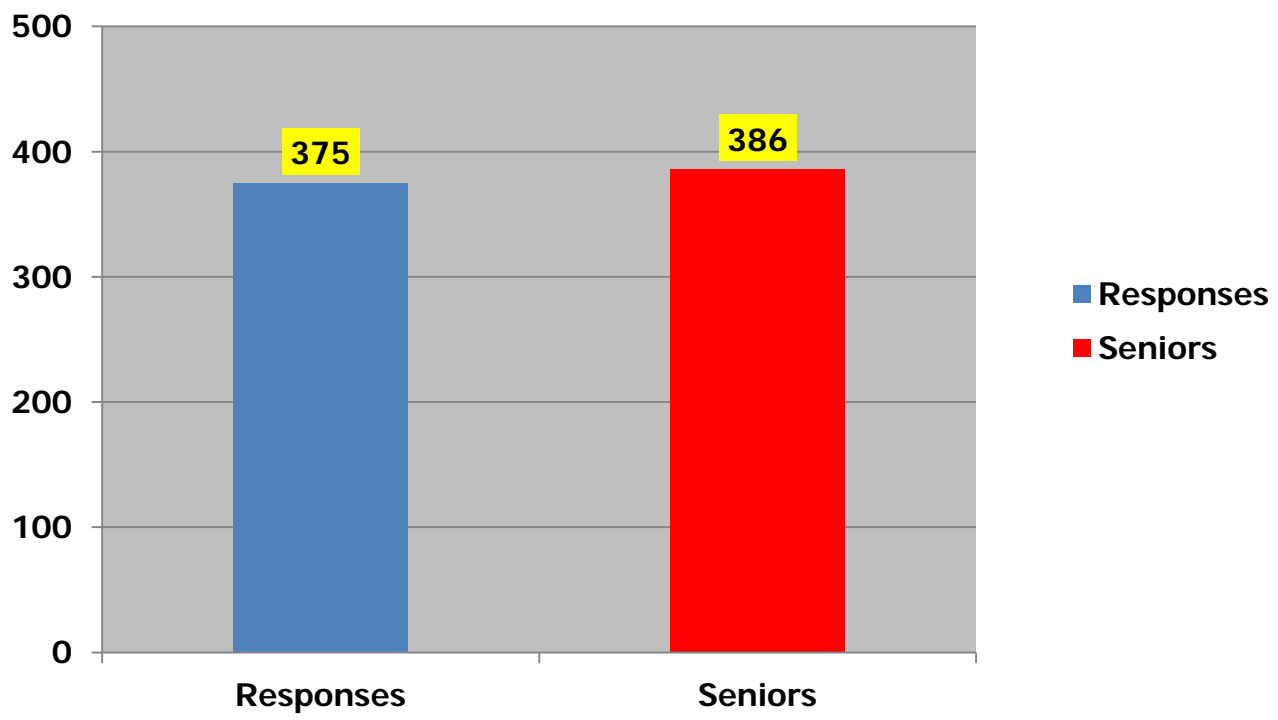
Recommendations

Viewing these statistics by Cluster will benefit C⁴ in its review of the results.

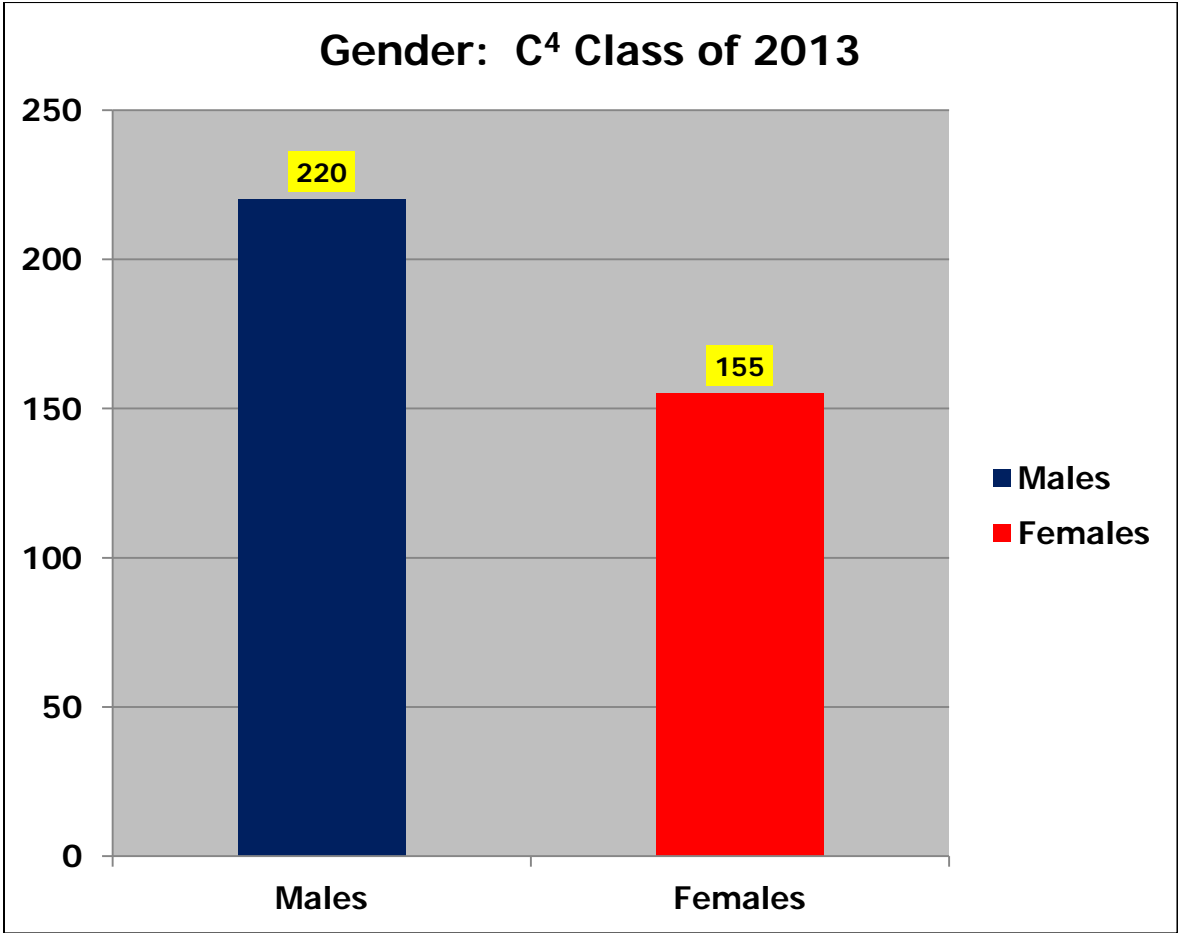
1. Career Majors meetings will analyze the information appropriate to each program area of study.
2. Staff will identify positive results and share best practices contributing to those results.
3. Best practices will then be shared with all staff for program improvement.
4. Staff will identify areas of concern and brainstorm strategies for improvement. One such area of discussion could be a slightly lower satisfaction rate (0.139).
5. Seamless Pathway efforts give way to discussions for improving related employment.
6. Strategies will be shared with all staff.

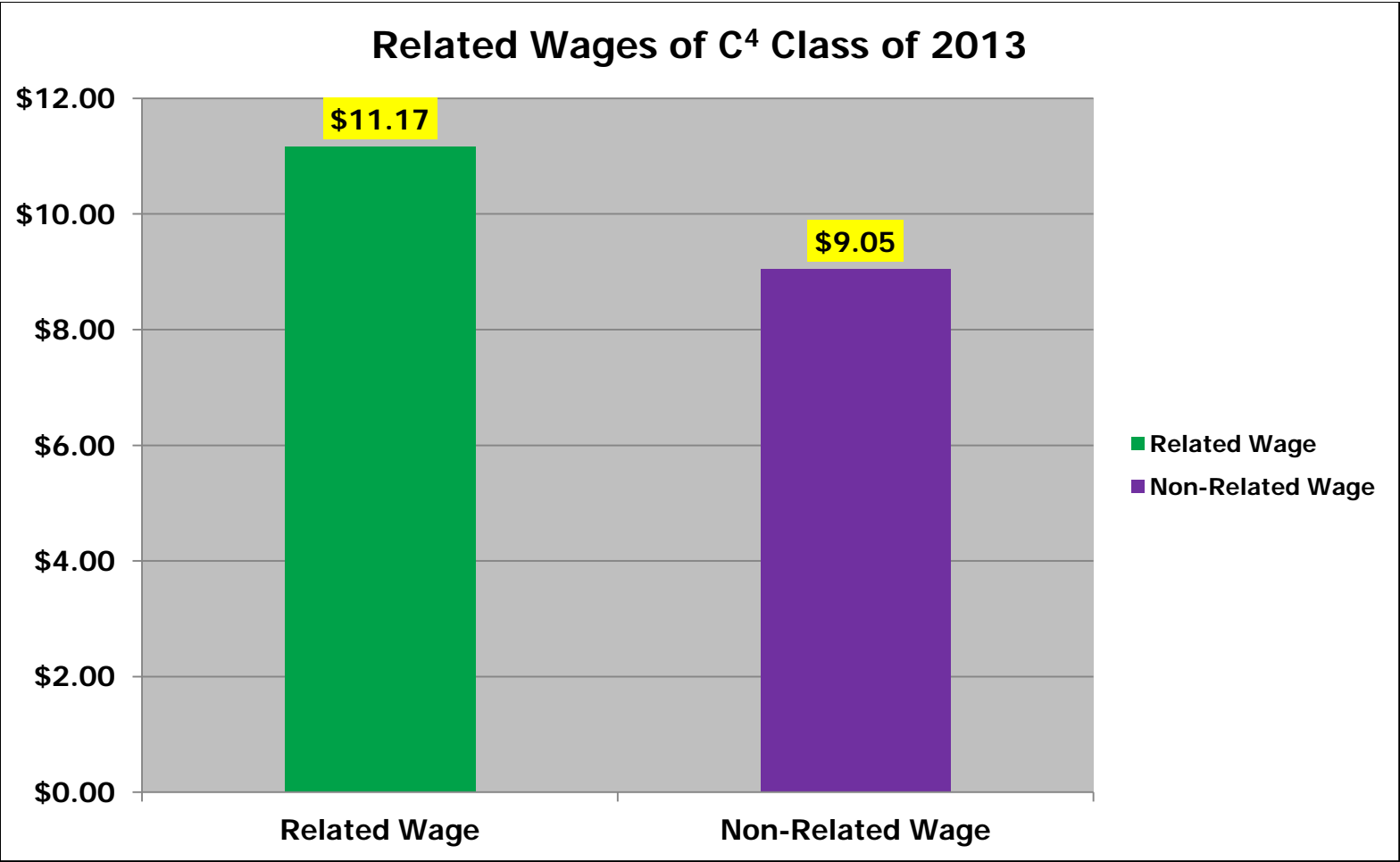

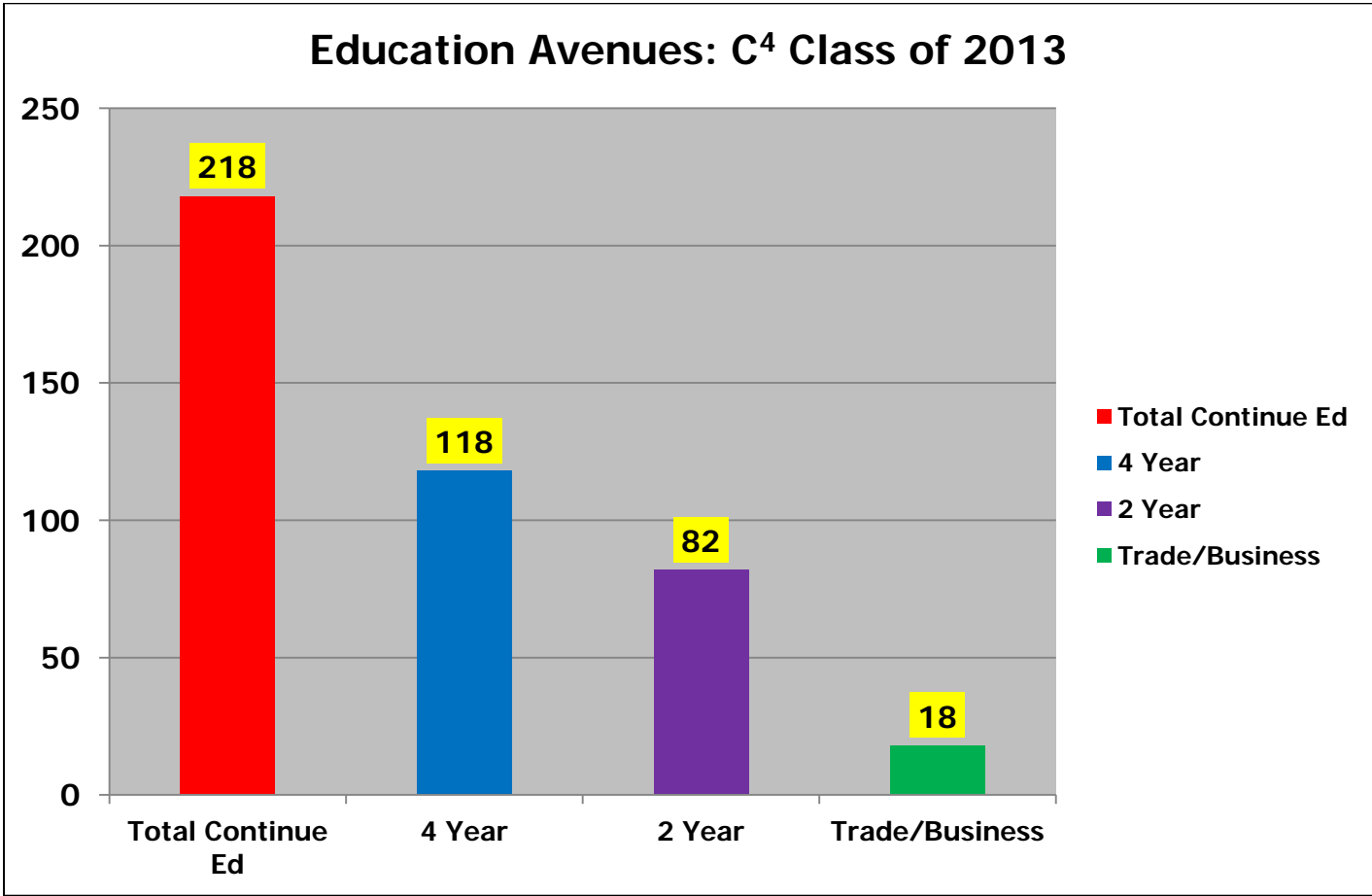
Honors Diplomas: C⁴ Class of 2013



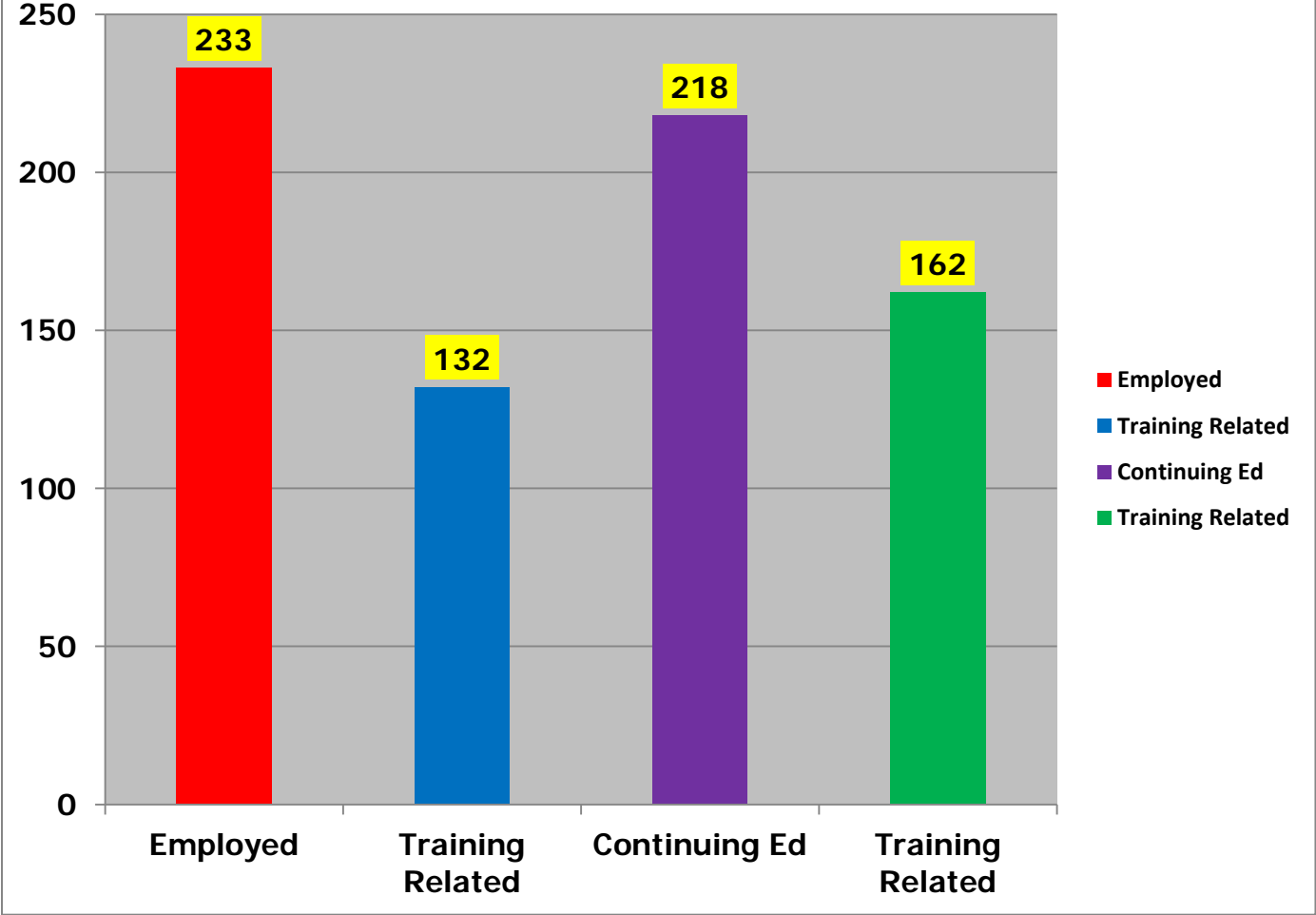

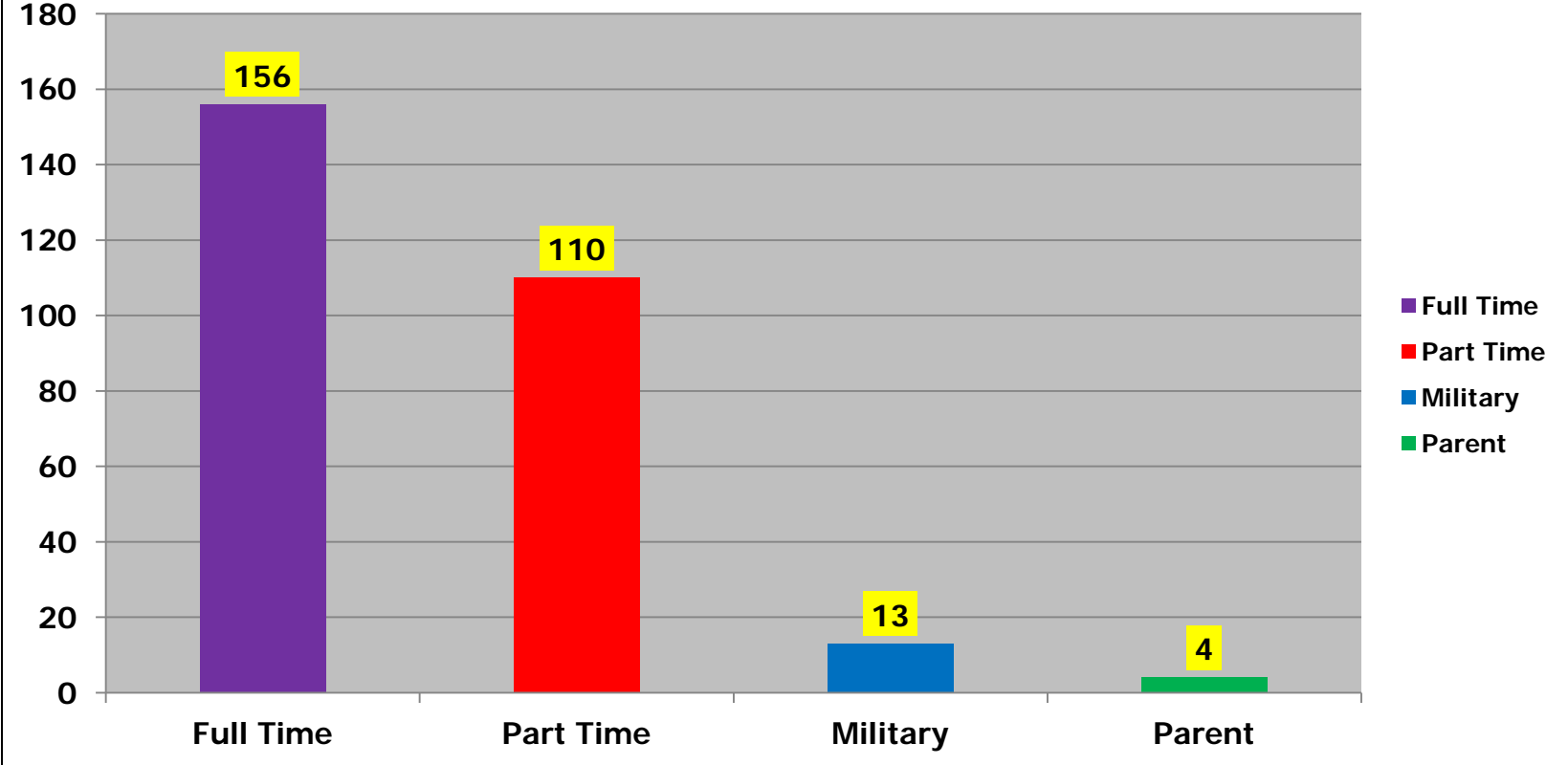

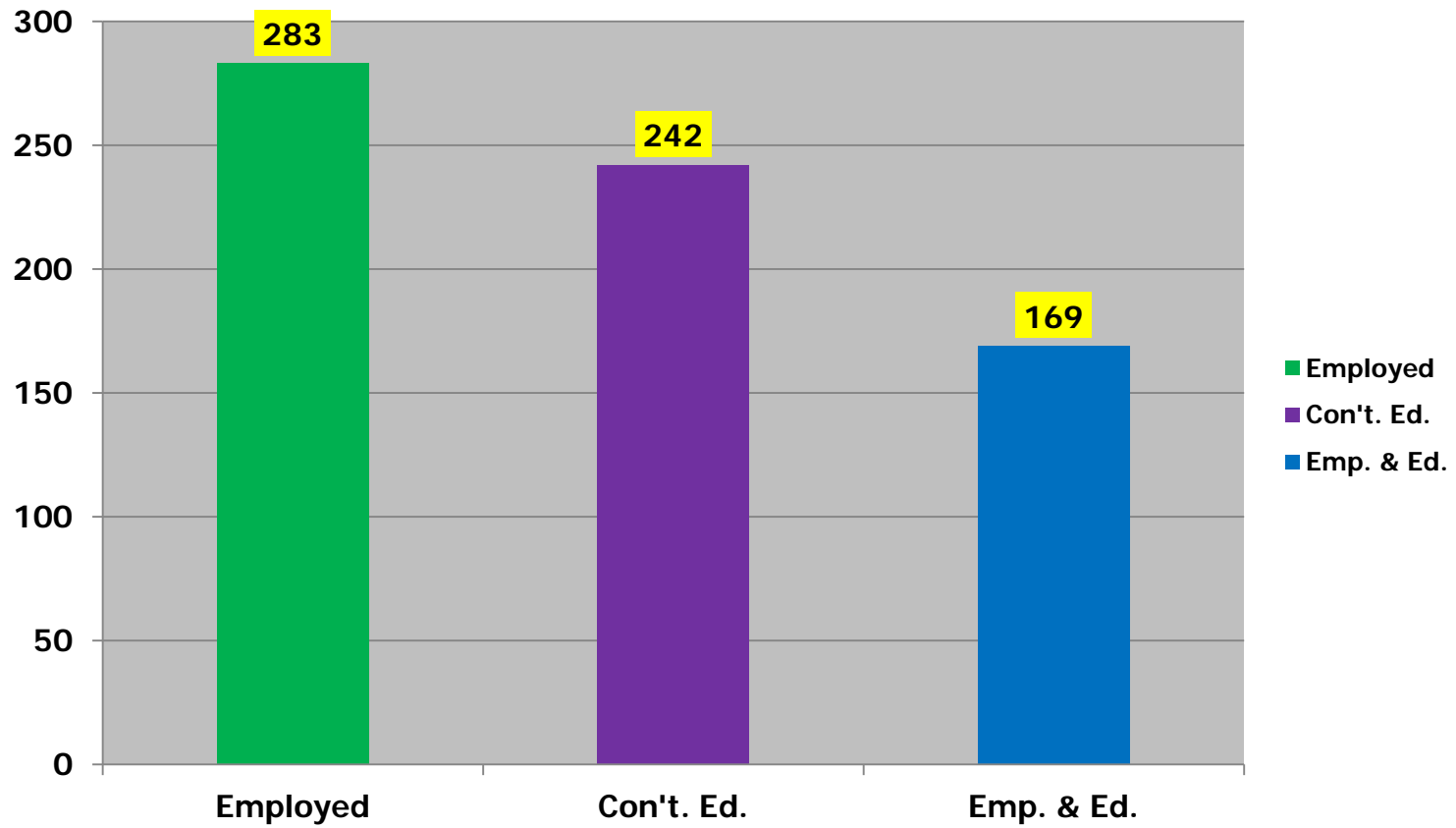
