C⁴ Columbus Area Career Connection 2015 - 2016 One-Year Follow-Up Study

The local One-Year Follow-Up Study of the class of 2015-2016 reports the status of **379 of the 379** exiting seniors who completed C⁴ programming their senior year of high school. This **100 percent return,** the highest return in the history of this study, certainly confirms that the findings in this study present a reliable and accurate status of each student. The findings, as detailed in this document, confirm the effectiveness of the education C⁴ provides each student in that they completed their C⁴ class, graduated from high school, continued their education and secured a higher wage from training-related employment.

 C^4 continues to meet the challenge of completing two follow-up studies involving two different sets of students. This local C^4 study cohort includes a graduating class of students who were enrolled in a multiple-hour C^4 Career & Technical Education (CTE) class or Project Lead the Way (PLTW) classes during their senior year, thus showing the impact teachers, staff and programming have on C^4 student success. By contrast, the State study includes the senior class of students who took at least six credits in CTE during the course of high school, not necessarily during their senior year and not all CTE credits necessarily from C^4 or the Area CTE District (District #41).

It came as no surprise that contacting students was once again a challenge; however, having student mobile numbers made a positive difference. While accurate and reliable, some information came from family members, teachers or social media, leaving some information unavailable such as satisfaction with C^4 and hourly wages earned. In comparing this information with previous years, the variance is insignificant to the results. There has always been reluctance in reporting wages, and that continues to hold true. One could deduce that satisfaction, while very abstract, could come from the connection between training related figures for employment and education. Overall, **94.9 percent** of the C^4 Class of 2016 was employed or enrolled in continued education, with **77.3 percent related to the training they received from C^4** which could infer satisfaction, and certainly supports the effectiveness of C^4 education.

Our vision states that "C⁴ will connect community resources to provide career education for all students while laying the foundation for life-long learning." The results of this study are found to be highly reflective of the total class, due to the 100 percent return rate.

C⁴ has chosen to view follow-up statistics by Clusters, which are areas of Career and Technical Education leading to various pathways. This view provides a more focused perspective and promotes program improvement through teams developed to deliver connected occupational training. Clusters will compile trend data to enable teams to set goals for improvement and monitor achievement.

As a result, the information gained from respondents of the Class of 2016 is shared in the statistical review of the findings and recommendations that follow:

Wage Statistics (See Wage chart & graphs, pages 12 & 13)

At the time of this study, the minimum wage remains at \$7.25 per hour. Overall, **75 of 106** students reporting training related wage information **(70.8%)** and **91 of 160 (56.9%)** students reported non-training-related wages on this study. C⁴ learned the following wage information from a total wage reporting percentage of **62.4% (166 of 266)**:

The Training Related Wage averaged \$12.68 per hour
The Non-Training Related Wage averaged \$10.61 per hour.

The Training Related wage is \$5.43 above minimum wage, and \$2.07 more than those who earned wages from non-training-related employment.

While \$2.07 doesn't seem like much money added over a period of a year, it would provide a beginning worker \$4,305.60 more on top of that year's wages.

Review of Findings

1. The never-before-achieved **100 percent return rate** confirms that the findings in this study present a reliable and accurate status of each student. Additionally, this return rate confirms the effectiveness of the education C⁴ provides each student in that they completed their C⁴ class, graduated from high school, continued their education and secured a higher wage from training-related employment.

- 2. Overall, **76.3** percent of the respondents provided C⁴ Satisfaction (4.606 on a scale of 1-5, with 5 being the highest) information which confirms that C⁴ students are happy with their C⁴ education and training and they believe that C⁴ provided them with the foundation on which to build their future success.
- 3. The **graduation** rate for the class of 2016 is strong at 98.7 percent. While Indiana is a waivered State for No Child Left Behind (NCLB), the changes associated with the waiver are still unclear. This study documents the graduation rate to include all students who earned a work-based readiness waiver, certificate of completion, GED or any State-recognized diploma. The NCLB graduation rate stands at 96.8 percent. It should be noted that this study found a significant drop (8%) from last year to this year of students earning a general diploma. A substantial difference was noted in BCSC students earning a general diploma (14 students or 27.5 percent) vs county students earning general diploma (72.5 percent). There were 46 students earning general diplomas from the class of 2014, 84 from the class of 2015 and 51 from the class of 2016. It is interesting to note that the Indiana General High School Diploma requirements call for a minimum of six (6) College and Career Pathway credits.
- 4. The total of respondents **employed** has remained steady at 70.2%; however, the training related employment dropped from 47 percent to 39.8 percent. This could be due, in part, to more students pursuing employment to supplement education that is training related.
- 5. **Continuing education** remained steady at 57 percent. Of those continuing their educations, 80.6 percent are enrolled in higher education programs related to the C⁴ CTE area of study. The highest training related statistic of 80 percent was recorded in 2008, due to the recession and the economy giving way to increased enrollments in higher education. C⁴ graduates are receiving valuable training in high school through Seamless Pathway efforts to carry on their education by connecting them to post-secondary schools.
- 6. **Military** enlistment remains steady at six percent, with 62.5 percent from criminal justice and automotive technology students. It should be noted that the 81.3 percent of all students enlisted in Military service are utilizing their training earned from C⁴.
- 7. The minimum wage at the time of this study was \$7.25, making the average training related wage \$5.43 above the minimum. Overall, the training related wage is \$2.07 higher than the average non-training related wage of \$10.61, confirming that C⁴ education develops graduates who are worthy of earning higher competitive wages.

- 8. The **training related wage** averaged at \$11.56 per hour represents an increase from last year's study by \$1.12, while the non-training-related wage increased by \$0.29. Over the last few years, the trend has been that the non-training wage is rising, yet still lower than the training related wage. This is possibly due to government talks about increasing the minimum wage to a potential \$15.00 per hour. Some employers may be paying a higher wage so that individuals can purchase insurance on their own. Regardless of the reasons for the wages, the fact remains that the training related wage is still more than two dollars per hour higher than the non-training related wage.
- 9. C⁴ asks respondents to rate their overall **satisfaction** and benefit of taking a C⁴ program. Responding on a scale of one to five, with five being the highest, 289 of the respondents (76.3%) ranked their satisfaction with C⁴ education at 4.606. In comparing this information with previous years, the variance is insignificant to the results; however, the rate is the highest ever recorded with this study, up from 4.581 last year.
- 10. With reluctance in reporting wages and satisfaction being an abstract opinion, C⁴ looks at the connection between training related figures for employment and education. Overall, 77.3 percent of the C⁴ Class of 2016 was engaged in training related activities which could infer satisfaction, and certainly supports the effectiveness of C⁴ education.

Closing Comments:

Each year that a C⁴ Follow-Up Study is completed, it is interesting to watch the statistics unfold to tell the C⁴ story for that class of students who are continuing their journey after high school. This is the ninth year for the C⁴ Follow-Up study to look at those students who were not engaged in employment, continued education, military service or stay-at-home parents.

This study found that fourteen (14) of the 379 (3.7 percent) students contacted were not engaged. This means that 96.3 percent (365) of the students who completed C⁴ programs during the 2015-16 school year were either competitively employed, pursuing higher education, raising their children as stay-at-home parents or enlisted in military service after high school.

It is significant to note that of those fourteen respondents, eight (57.1 percent) earned a certificate or general diploma, offering an explanation for why they are not engage in employment or education at the time of this study. Five (35.7 percent) earned Core 40 and one (7.2 percent) earned a Technical Honors Diploma. A potential explanation for these six could be that being a member of

Generation Z, they want more than just a job. They are looking for a sense of fulfillment and excitement in their job that will help them to move forward in the world. They could be utilizing technology to search for just the right position and have not found it yet.

C⁴ learned that **77.3 percent of the graduates from the class of 2016 were using their C⁴ education in their current positive placements.**

This data coupled with a **98.7 percent graduation rate** (96.8 percent NCLB graduation rate) certainly proves that C⁴ provides students with valuable career and technical education training while still in high school, paving the road to a bright, competitive future of life-long learning.

Area 41: Participating School Information



Recommendations


Viewing these statistics by Cluster will benefit C⁴ in its review of the results.

- 5. Strategies will be shared with all staff.


