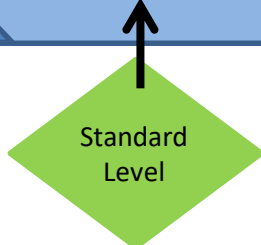

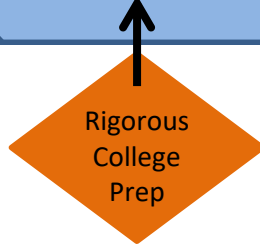

*8th Grade Science Teachers may recommend an alternate class for students who struggle in science.

*Students may take Physics I after completing Geometry, but Chemistry I is typically recommended first.

For example, if you earn a C+ in Spanish 1 during either semester of 8th grade, you should retake Spanish 1 during 9th grade.
