- Students may pick up textbooks after receiving their schedules (11:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m.)


Your attendance at this event will make the first days of school much easier.

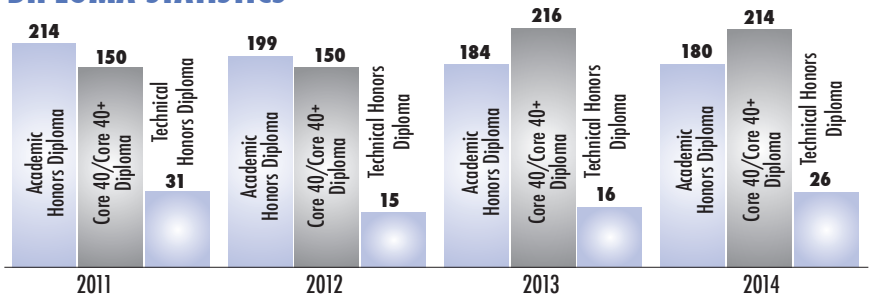

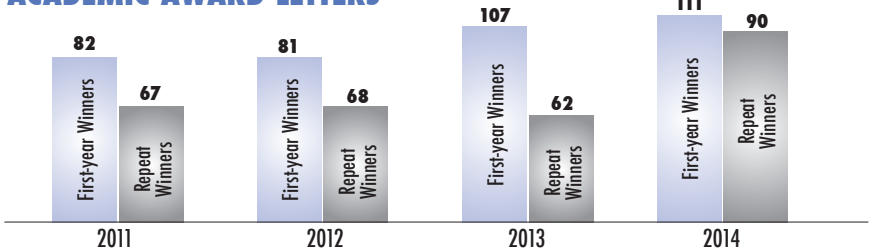

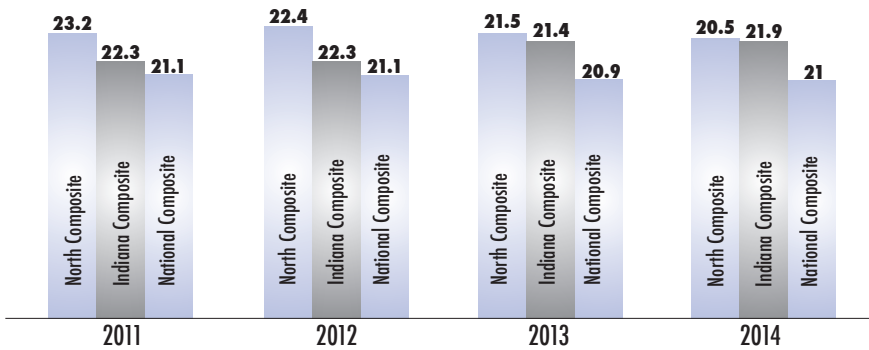

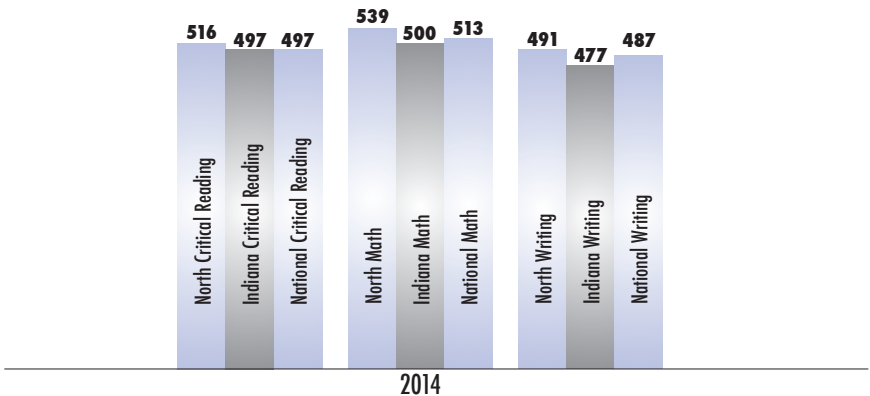
