# PRINCIPAL'S LETTER


## DEAR BULL DOG:

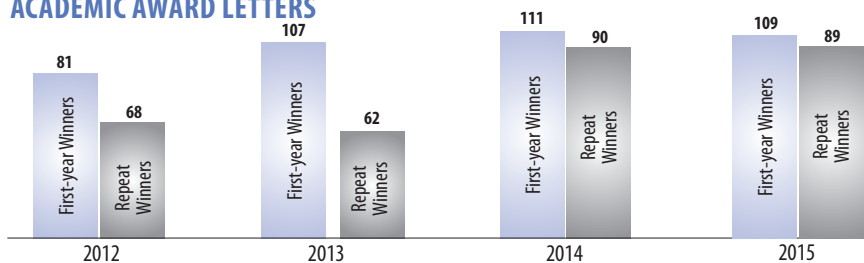

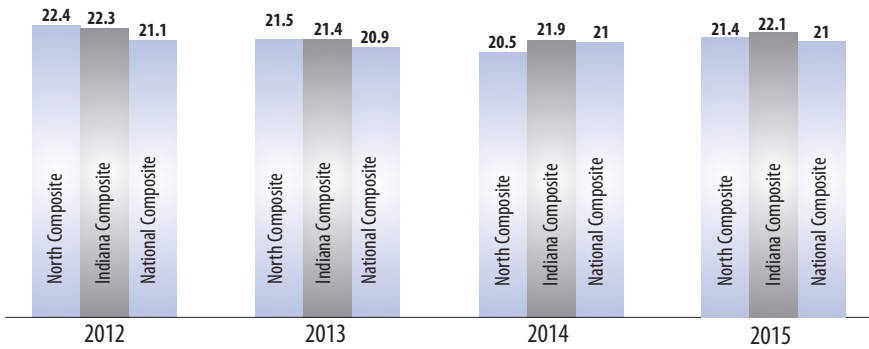

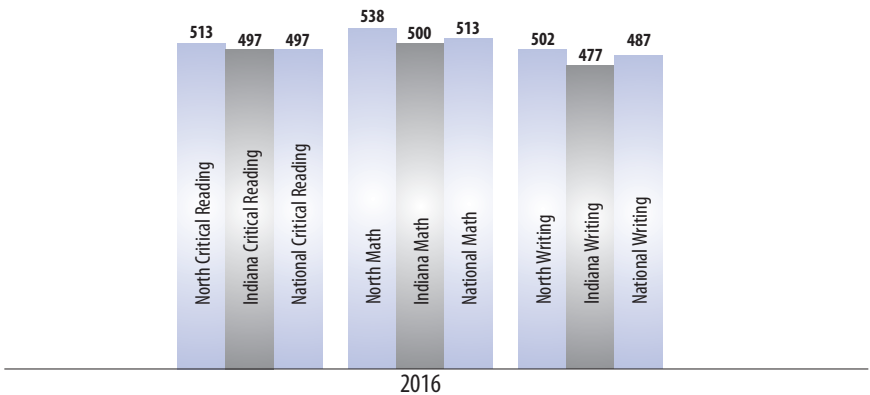

## PROCESSES FOR THE FIRST WEEK OF SCHOOL:

Books: Books will be distributed through individual classes. Book and fee bills are mailed home in September. Once a book is issued, book return is the responsibility of the student.
