INDIANA SHERIFF'S ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIPS

Bartholomew County Sheriff Matthew A. Myers announced today that the Indiana Sheriffs' Association will again be awarding college scholarships to gualified high school seniors or college students who are pursuing a degree in criminal justice studies.

There will be approximately 40 - \$750 scholarships awarded to gualifying students throughout the state. The Indiana Sheriffs' Association Scholarship Fund was established for the purpose of receiving, investing and dispensing of funds to provide college scholarships to qualified students who are committed to pursuing an education and career in the law enforcement field.

To qualify for one of these scholarships, the applicant must be an Indiana resident, be a current member of the association or a dependent child or grandchild of a current member of the association, attend an Indiana college or university, major in a law enforcement field and enroll as a full-time student (12 hours). Applications needed to apply for the scholarships are available from your high school counselor or the sheriff's office. The applications must be completed and received by the Indiana Sheriffs' Association on or before April 1, 2020.

Ivy Tech Community College Volunteer Firefighter Scholarship

(For Active Volunteer Firefighters and EMS Personnel)

Thank you for serving your community. We deeply appreciate your time and commitment, and in return, we want to help you and your family.

The scholarship provides funds for individuals in any Ivy Tech Community College program, as long as they are an active volunteer firefighter or EMS personnel.

Here are some other things to consider about the scholarship:

How to enroll and claim free tuition:

- 1. Apply to Ivy Tech Community College.
- 2. Complete the **FAFSA** to apply for financial aid.
- 3. Request a letter from the fire department or medical provider confirming your active volunteer

status. Once you have the letter, send it to your local lvy Tech Registrar's office.

Once your student account is coded by the Registrar's office, you will be able to declare a program of study and sign up for classes in your chosen program.

Please remember to resubmit a letter every term. If you need to stop attending classes for a period of time, a new letter must be presented upon your re-enrollment at Ivy Tech.

COLUMBUS EDUCATORS ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Columbus Educators Association Scholarship is awarded annually to the dependent of a CEA member. Announcement of the winner(s) of this \$1000 (\$500/semester) award is made at the annual high school honors program in May.

The student must meet the following criteria for selection:

- 1. Be the dependent of a current CEA member.
- 2. Be a graduating senior.
- 3. Use the scholarship at an accredited college or technical school in the fall term following graduation from high school

Other factors which may be considered:

- 1. Quality of high school preparation for college.
- 2. Class rank and GPA in high school.
- 3. Extra-curricular participation in the school and community.
- 4. Need.
- 5. An interest in a career in, but not limited to, education.

AOPA HIGH SCHOOL FLIGHT TRAINING SCHOLARSHIP

The Ray Foundation, 80 exceptional high school students, ages 15 to 18, each will receive a \$10,000 scholarship in 2020. This scholarship program is a component of the AOPA You Can Fly program, a collection of initiatives working towards building a larger, more vibrant pilot community.

Scholarship recipients will be able to use the money for direct flight training expenses to pursue a primary pilot certificate, such as a private, sport, or recreational pilot certificate. They must also complete a flight training milestone, achieving either solo or earning a primary pilot certificate, within one year of receiving a scholarship.

The \$1,000 scholarship is awarded annually with an option to renew for three consecutive years.

Criteria for selection includes academic achievement, leadership in co-curricular activities and community involvement and submission of an essay and recommendations. A seven-semester transcript is required to complete application process.

Application deadline is March 1 with the scholarship awarded in May. OUIS B. RUSSELL SCHOLARSHIP

Eligible: Minority, Indiana public high school seniors

This scholarship is open to a minority public high school senior who plans to pursue industrial arts, vocational education or technical preparation at an accredited post-secondary institution. This scholarship was named for Louis Russell, an African-American industrial arts educator, who acquired international recognition as the world's longest-living heart transplant patient. The \$1,000 scholarship is awarded annually with an option to renew for one consecutive year.

Applicants must be a minority pursuing education in the vocational arts and a graduate of the class of the current year entering a fully-accredited postsecondary institution as a freshman. Criteria for selection includes academic achievement, leadership in co-curricular activities and community involvement and submission of an essay and recommendations. A seven-semester transcript is required to complete application process. Application deadline is March 1 with the scholarship awarded in May.



Most all colleges request transcripts be sent electronically. **Create an account with an email you will use after graduation.** Your school email will expire after you graduate and you may need to access your high school transcript after graduation. College Application Reminders

- Most college applications need to be submitted by November 1st for students to be considered for merit scholarships.
- SAT/ACT scores <u>must</u> be sent directly from the testing center
- Please allow approximately 10 school days for teachers and counselors to complete recommendations (if required). **Plan ahead as teachers and counselors get many requests**
- Submit college applications before fall break for November 1 deadlines.
- Check for FAFSA deadlines specific to colleges where applying
- For the 2019-2020 school year, you can file anytime from October 1, 2018, to June 30, 2020
