OUR COMMISSIONED WORK

This year's music festival will be of special significance to the directors, students, and audience members present as we all experience the very first performance of the Douglas Court composition, <u>Take Center Stage</u>. Last September, the directors began seeking a composer to score an entirely original work to be performed at this year's festival concert. Our search of composers led us to Mr. Court, who happily agreed to undertake this challenging task. After seeing the first drafts of the full score, we were excited and eager to begin rehearsals with our students. The most exciting experience, though, is that of being the first band ever to perform this exciting new concert band work.

The only other commissioned work by our school corporation was premiered on May 11, 1968. Entitled, <u>A Hymn for Our Times</u>, by Grant Beglarian, this work was composed around the poem, "Once to Every Man and Nation," by James Russell Lowell. In the 1968 program notes, Mr. Beglarian wrote that "soon the poem assumed a significance that was both urgent and highly relevant to our times," referring in part to the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr. on April 4, 1968.

A bold, defining statement by the flutes, clarinets, trumpets, and horns begins this concert march and summons the other instruments of the band to join in after each opening fanfare. This beginning gives way to a calm and lyrical melody played by the flutes, alto saxophones and trumpets. The melody is developed and divided between all the instruments leading to a short, but powerful percussion interlude. As the piece returns to the original setting of the melody, it slows to a dramatic and triumphant conclusion.

Woodrow Charles Herman (b. Wisconsin, 1913, d. Los Angeles, 1987) was an American jazz saxophonist, clarinetist, and composer. This jazz chart arranged by Johnny Vinson for concert band features, of course, saxophones and clarinets! The low brass and low woodwinds create the "walking bass line" while the trumpets and flutes add the syncopated pops and punches that give this piece an authentic big-band sound.

Convergence

This piece seemed to be a very appropriate choice for this particular concert where students from two different schools are indeed "coming together" to perform this piece for you tonight. The composer writes, "It has been my experience that there has to be a certain amount of convergence that takes place in any performance by a large ensemble. The beauty of working together in a concert band setting is in the collective creation of a stirring and musical performance." Convergence takes hold of the listener from the opening melodic statement with its wide, open intervals. After a dramatic tempo change, the composer slowly begins to "fill in" these open intervals by gradually adding the other instruments of the band.

Flourish for Wind Band


Ralph Vaughan Williams

Vaughan Williams was born at Down Ampney, Gloucestershire in 1872 and died in London in 1958. He was a conductor, organist, and composer of music for almost every genre, believing that a composer should "make his art an expression of the whole life of the community." As one of the leaders of the 20th-century revival of English music, he was strongly influenced by English folk song. As well as scoring symphonies and operas, he also wrote for neglected instruments, such as a concerto for harmonica and tuba. Flourish for Wind Band was composed as an overture to Music and the People, and was premiered in the Royal Albert Hall, London in April, 1939.



The Lion of Lucerne

The Swiss have had a long tradition of supplying mercenaries to foreign governments. A pope or emperor could be confident that his Swiss Guards would not turn on him when the political winds shifted direction. In 1792, during the French Revolution, more than 700 Swiss Guards died defending the palace of King Louis XVI. The memory of these guards was preserved in the famous sculpture, Lion of Lucerne, by Danish artist, Bertel Thorvaldsen. James Curnow was so moved by the sculpture that he decided to write an overture to attempt to capture the spirit of the sculpture.

Featuring the percussion section, this composition is rhythmically challenging and very exciting. It begins with driving rhythms in the percussion followed by powerful brass and soothing woodwind features. Nelybel is known as an outstanding Russian composer who has written several works including <u>Trittico</u> and <u>Symphonic Movement</u>.

Toccata For Band

Frank Erickson

Very few works have influenced the band movement in this country as has this work, arguably the most popular of Frank Erickson's compositions. The first public performance was by the U.C.L.A. concert band at the 1957 Music Educator's National Convention in Pasadena. In classical music, a toccata usually indicates a work for piano at a fast tempo with many scales and arpeggios. As you listen to this selection, you might use your imagination to picture how this piece would sound on the piano.

I was both honored and challenged at the thought of writing a piece of music for the Bartholomew Consolidated School Corporation music festival. Seldom does a composer get to write a piece of music that will be performed by over 800 students at the same time. This was an exciting thought and a project I was anxious to be involved in.



I received specific instructions on how the piece would work involving three levels of schools and set out to write <u>Take Center Stage</u>. The title is really a tribute and celebration of the young people involved in this concert. The piece is designed so that students from elementary through high school can participate in this performance. I hope that you will hear in the music some of the excitement and energy of the students as they combine their talents and celebrate with <u>Take Center Stage</u>.

Douglas Court is a native of Toronto, Canada where he received his early musical training in The Salvation Army. His formal training was received at the University of Toronto where he studied trumpet and graduated with a Bachelor of Music degree. Mr. Court has also studied composition at the University of South Florida. While living in Toronto, Mr. Court worked as a freelance trumpet player performing with several ensembles and groups such as the Canadian Opera Company Orchestra. He was also a member of the cornet section of the Canadian Staff Band for five years and toured extensively with this group.

From 1986 through 1995, Mr. Court held the position of Divisional Music Director of The Salvation Army in the state of Florida. This involved conducting both adult and youth ensembles as well as organizing a summer music program. In July of 1995, Mr. Court moved to Crofton, Maryland with his wife and two children to pursue full time writing.
